Suffolk County Sheriff's Office: PROJECT LIFESAVER

Project Lifesaver is a countywide emergency response locator service capable of finding individuals with cognitive impairment if they wander and become lost. Clients wear a personalized one ounce battery operated transmitter bracelet which emits a tracking signal every second, 24 hours a day. Transmitters are smaller than a quarter and each transmitter has its own unique frequency. Additionally, the Sheriff's Project Lifesaver personnel are specially trained, not only in search and

rescue with the use of the electronic tracking equipment, but also in the methods necessary to communicate with a person who has a cognitive impairment such as Autism, or other mental challenges. To be eligible for Project Lifesaver, clients must be a resident of Suffolk County and have a cognitive impairment diagnosis that is confirmed by a physician...[more info](#)

Councilwoman Connie Kepert Visits the new David Overton Road Multi-Use Trail

12/28/15 Farmingville, NY – Councilwoman Connie Kepert visited the recently completed multi-use path along the David Overton Trail that travels through the Overton Preserve. The David Overton Preserve, which extends through the hamlets of Coram, Gordon Heights, and Medford, is several hundred acres of woodlands, wetlands and meadows. As the President of the Middle Island Civic Association, Councilwoman Kepert fought for the preservation of this environmentally and historically significant land. After taking office in 2006, the Councilwoman worked to secure a \$140,000 New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation grant for the design and construction of a multi-use path along the historic roadway that runs through the preserve.



“I am happy to finally announce that the David Overton Trail is complete,” said Councilwoman Connie Kepert. “As one of my last acts on the town council I am now happy to open a bike trail which runs through this beautiful preserve. I will continue to work with our Suffolk County

Legislators to create additional hiking and biking opportunities in this area so that the public can protect and enjoy this area. Thank you to the Town's Parks Department for their hard work in creating this path.”

Editor's Note: This was one of Councilwoman's final official acts as District 4 Councilwoman for the Town of Brookhaven. Michael Loguercio won the election in November and is now the new council representative for District 4.
