<u>Parade Route</u>: Parade starts on Route 112 and East Main Street and runs west to the corner of West Avenue and West Main.



Will the Common Core step up schools' focus on grammar? EDUCATION WEEK; Feb 23, 2016 Interestingly, the grammar skills in the content standards don't differ too much from most previous state standards, the writers say. For instance, they ask students to "use an apostrophe to form contractions" and "form and use regular and irregular verbs"—benchmarks that shouldn't much surprise teachers. The standards do, however, focus more on grammar application than most previous state standards, some say—which could encourage more authentic grammar work. "Whereas before it was OK for a kid to identify nouns, now, it's that they actually have to be able to use them and use them correctly," said Everette, an Alabama teacher. "A lot of the skills do overlap from what we had before, but you're taking it to the next level and applying it to your real writing."...read article

(Advertisement, 1917). This New York State Woman Suffrage Party advertisement appealing to "Men of New York" appeared in the Babylon South Side Signal on November 2, 1917, Four days later. on Nov. 6, 1917, women won the right to vote in New York State. Three years later, that right was granted to women nationwide. During Women's History Month, we celebrate one of the most remarkable and successful civil rights efforts in our nation's history. The year 2016 marks the 96th anniversary of the Woman Suffrage Movement's great victory: the ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
