

While Mr. Falcone wants to boast that LIPA rates have actually come down over the past couple of years, he fails to mention that the only rate showing a decline from 2013 is the Power Charge which has nothing to do with LIPA's operating skills and everything to do with world market pricing for oil and natural gas. And let's not forget the **Revenue Decoupling Adjustment** that LIPA added to our bills this year to make up for the drop in their budgeted revenue resulting mainly from home solar installations. That alone added 1.25% to my April/May bill.

Grid, NextERA propose solar farm at Shoreham nuke plant site NEWSDAY; Jun 22, 2016 National Grid and NextEra are proposing to build the largest solar energy array in the state on 350 acres of wooded property beside the shuttered Shoreham nuclear plant in a move that could stoke the greenfor-green debate. "We are adamantly opposed to this project, and we will not allow any trees to be cut," said Ed Romaine, supervisor for the Town of Brookhaven, where the project would be located. "This is not the place for solar. It's the wrong place for the wrong project for the wrong reasons."...read article Editor's Thoughts: I believe in solar. I'm for solar. I'm just not "all" for solar. Seems to make sense for home installations...although LIPA is now charging us for the budgeted revenue that they are not realizing due primarily to the lost energy sales to home solar customers. So now the LIPA ratepayers as a whole are paying LIPA for the savings that home solar users are enjoying. As to these "solar farms" or "solar plants," all I read about is the negative effects on the environment. While that is true in most cases, what about the negative affect on our bills? Solar and wind are being contracted by LIPA at between 16¢ and 23¢ per kilowatt hour; usually on 20-yr. contracts. That becomes the Power Charge on our bills. For 2016 YTD, our Power Charge for traditional gas/oil generated electricity averages 6.5¢ per kilowatt hour. The cost of solar and wind from these farms/plants therefore will raise our Power Charge between 146% and 254% for each renewable kWh used.


